Putting our Faith into Action: It Is Time!!!

Last October we completed the first phase of strategic planning with the process of developing a vision in line with our mission to "Make Disciples of Christ for the Transformation of the World." Our vision statement is "Growing Together In Grace with God, with Others." By year end, the Board identified, developed, and agreed to focus our church's attention and efforts upon four pillars, or goals, for 2016. They include:

Growing Together In Grace with God, with Others

FACILITY

To continue focusing upon our facility and property to meet the present and future missional needs God is calling us to serve. For 2016, this includes the completion of exterior projects: a memorial garden (which is near completion), outdoor lighting, tuck-pointing, roofing, guttering, landscaping and drainage. Centennial Campaign funds and special gifts were used for expenses. Now we can start a complete indoor remodel of the entire first floor. (excluding the Sanctuary) for the sole purpose of updating it into a more radically hospitable and welcoming church home.

STAFFING AND TEAM MINISTRY

To staff for the future missional needs of the church.

This includes our reviewing all paid staff job descriptions, and rewriting responsibilities, expectations, and compensation as needed. It also includes empowering church members to serve as servant leaders, in unpaid staffing positions, to meet the missional needs of the church. This is the charge of Staff Parish Relations and the Leadership Development Core.

INVITE, FORM, SEND

To develop a clear path of discipleship for all persons inside and outside membership, through worship, formation, and service.

This includes inviting and care ministries, stewardship and hands-on service. We are striving to put our church's intentions into practice. This is the charge of the Pastor, Staff, Leadership Core, and Strategic Ministries Team.

STEWARDSHIP

To develop and implement stewardship as an essential part of being a disciple of Christ.

Stewardship, in general, means taking seriously our vows of prayer, presence, gifts, service and witness, and truly committing ourselves to their being our habitual graces as "little Christs." This is the charge of the Finance Team and Legacy Team and others.



What is Cursillo?

Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning "short course" or a "little journey." Thus a Cursillo in Christianity is a "short course in the Christian Faith" or a "little journey in Christian living." Our format is presenting 5 talks each day of a 3-day weekend. For many people it is an uplifting renewal in a different way than their home church worship and ministries. Some even describe a mountain-top experience. The talks present a method of staying close to Christ and sharing love with others.
