#### THE LIGHT OF CHRIST AT CCUMC

Pastor Jenn and Ken Starkey have been recruiting and instructing members for new hospitality teams to serve during Sunday morning and special worship services. Ken has explained the symbolism of what an acolyte does when he or she lights the altar candles and extinguishes them during the Prelude and the concluding hymn of praise, respectively. When the acolyte processes with the candlelighter during the Prelude, she is bringing the light of Christ into the sanctuary to signal the beginning of worship.

The lit alter candles during the service symbolize the pres-

ence of God among the congregation during worship. Before the acolyte extinguishes the candles during the final hymn of praise, she lights the candlelighter and carries it to the rear of the sanctuary, which reminds us of the calling of all disciples to carry the light of Christ into the world.

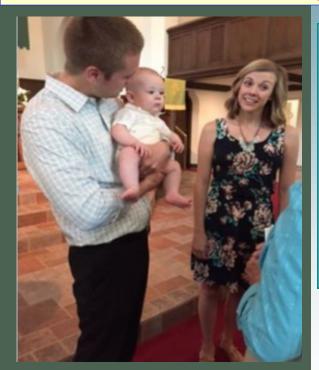


#### Health Screening—September 16!
